

House Bill No. 1023

An act relating to a public records exemption for county employee assistance program records; amending s. 125.585, F.S.; narrowing the exemption for records relating to an employee's participation in a county employee assistance program to provide that a county employee's personal identifying information contained in employee assistance program records is confidential and exempt; making editorial changes; removing the October 2, 2003, repeal thereof scheduled pursuant to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Notwithstanding the October 2, 2003, repeal of said section scheduled pursuant to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995, section 125.585, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

125.585 Employee assistance programs; public records exemption confidentiality.—

(1) As used in this section, "employee assistance program" means a counseling, therapeutic, or other professional treatment program provided by a county to assist any county employee who has a behavioral disorder, or medical disorder, or substance abuse problem, or who has an emotional difficulty which affects the employee's job performance, through referral for counseling, therapy, or other professional treatment.

(2) A county employee's personal identifying information contained in ~~Any communication between a county employee and personnel or service providers of a county employee assistance program relating to that employee's participation in such program shall be a confidential communication. Any routine monitoring of telephone calls by the county does not violate this provision. All records held by the employing county relating to that employee's participation in an employee assistance program is~~ are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. ~~This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2003, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.~~

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2003.
