CHAPTER 2009-152

House Bill No. 7025

An act relating to a review under the Open Government Sunset Review Act regarding archival materials; renumbering and amending s. 257.35(1)(b), F.S.; transferring provisions which provide a public record exemption for all public records transferred to the custody of the division and any nonpublic manuscript and or other archival material which is placed in the keeping of the division under special terms and conditions; amending s. 257.38, F.S.; defining "nonpublic manuscript or other archival material"; clarifying the public records exemption for nonpublic manuscripts or other archival materials donated to and held by an official archive of a municipality or county contingent upon special terms and conditions that limit the right to inspect or copy such manuscripts or materials; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption; making editorial changes; amending s. 257.35, F.S.; reorganizing provisions; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 257.35, Florida Statutes, is transferred and redesignated as subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section 257.38, Florida Statutes, and amended, and that section is amended, to read:

257.38 Manuscripts or other archival material held by local government; public records exemption.—

(1)(b) For purposes of this section, "nonpublic manuscript or other archival material" means a manuscript or archival material that is not otherwise made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business by any governmental agency. Preserve and administer such records as shall be transferred to its custody; accept, arrange, and preserve them, according to approved archival practices; and permit them, at reasonable times and under the supervision of the division, to be inspected and copied.

(2) All public records transferred to the custody of the division shall be subject to the provisions of s. 119.07(1), except that any public record or other record provided by law to be confidential or prohibited from inspection by the public shall be made accessible only after a period of 50 years from the date of the creation of the record.

(3) Any nonpublic manuscript or other archival material which is placed in the keeping of the division under special terms and conditions, shall be made accessible only in accordance with such law terms and conditions and shall be exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) to the extent necessary to meet the terms and conditions for a nonpublic manuscript or other archival material.

(4) Any nonpublic A manuscript or other archival material that is donated to and held by an official archive of a municipality or county contin-

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gent upon special terms and conditions that limit the right to inspect or copy such manuscript or other material, but which manuscript or archival material is not otherwise made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business by any governmental agency, is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, except as otherwise provided in the special terms and conditions. However, A <u>nonpublic</u> manuscript or other archival material received under special terms and conditions as <u>authorized provided</u> by this <u>subsection</u> section shall be made available for inspection and copying 50 years after the date of the creation of the <u>nonpublic</u> manuscript or other archival material, at an earlier date specified in the special terms or conditions, or upon a showing of good cause before a court of competent jurisdiction.

(2) Subsection (1) is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 257.35, Florida Statutes, as amended by this act, is amended to read:

257.35 Florida State Archives.—

(1) There is created within the Division of Library and Information Services of the Department of State the Florida State Archives for the preservation of those public records, as defined in s. $119.011(\underline{12})$, manuscripts, and other archival material that have been determined by the division to have sufficient historical or other value to warrant their continued preservation and have been accepted by the division for deposit in its custody. It is the duty and responsibility of the division to:

(a) Organize and administer the Florida State Archives.

(b) Preserve and administer such records as shall be transferred to its custody; accept, arrange, and preserve them, according to approved archival practices; and permit them, at reasonable times and under the supervision of the division, to be inspected and copied.

(c) Assist the records and information management program in the determination of retention values for records.

(d) Cooperate with and assist insofar as practicable state institutions, departments, agencies, counties, municipalities, and individuals engaged in activities in the field of state archives, manuscripts, and history and accept from any person any paper, book, record, or similar material which in the judgment of the division warrants preservation in the state archives.

(e) Provide a public research room where, under rules established by the division, the materials in the state archives may be studied.

(f) Conduct, promote, and encourage research in Florida history, government, and culture and maintain a program of information, assistance, coor-

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dination, and guidance for public officials, educational institutions, libraries, the scholarly community, and the general public engaged in such research.

(g) Cooperate with and, insofar as practicable, assist agencies, libraries, institutions, and individuals in projects designed to preserve original source materials relating to Florida history, government, and culture and prepare and publish handbooks, guides, indexes, and other literature directed toward encouraging the preservation and use of the state's documentary resources.

(h) Encourage and initiate efforts to preserve, collect, process, transcribe, index, and research the oral history of Florida government.

(i) Assist and cooperate with the records and information management program in the training and information program described in s. 257.36(1)(g).

Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
