CHAPTER 2013-208

Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 1173

An act relating to the Florida Communications Fraud Act; amending s. 817.034, F.S.; providing a limitations period for civil and criminal actions under that act; providing that in a criminal proceeding the period does not run during any time the defendant is absent from the state or without a reasonably ascertainable place of abode or work within the state; limiting the amount of such an exception; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; reclassifying the offense of communications fraud with a value greater than \$50,000 on the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (d) is added to subsection (4) of section 817.034, Florida Statutes, to read:

817.034 Florida Communications Fraud Act.—

(4) OFFENSES.—

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a criminal action or civil action or proceeding under this section may be commenced at any time within 5 years after the cause of action accrues; however, in a criminal proceeding under this section, the period of limitation does not run during any time when the defendant is continuously absent from the state or is without a reasonably ascertainable place of abode or work within the state, but in no case shall this extend the period of limitation otherwise applicable by more than 1 year.

Section 2. Paragraphs (f) and (g) of subsection (3) of section 921.0022, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
