CHAPTER 2024-207

Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 535

An act relating to low-voltage alarm system projects; amending s. 553.793, F.S.; specifying that a nonelectric fence or wall must enclose the outside perimeter of a low-voltage electric fence; requiring a low-voltage electric fence to be a specified number of feet above such nonelectric fence or wall; permitting low-voltage electric fences to be installed in areas within more than one zoning category; prohibiting a municipality, county, district, or other entity of local government from adopting or maintaining certain ordinances or rules that provide additional requirements for low-voltage alarm system projects; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (b) and (d) of subsection (3) and subsection (10) of section 553.793, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

553.793 Streamlined low-voltage alarm system installation permitting.

(3) A low-voltage electric fence must meet all of the following requirements to be permitted as a low-voltage alarm system project, and no further permit shall be required for the low-voltage alarm system project other than as provided in this section:

(b) A nonelectric fence or wall must completely enclose the <u>outside</u> <u>perimeter of the</u> low-voltage electric fence. The low-voltage electric fence <u>must may be up to 2</u> feet higher than the perimeter nonelectric fence or wall.

(d) <u>A</u> The low-voltage electric fence is allowed shall not be installed in any an area unless the area is zoned exclusively for single-family or multifamily residential use. An area is not considered to be zoned exclusively for single-family or multifamily residential use if the area is within more than one zoning category.

(10) A municipality, county, district, or other entity of local government may not adopt or maintain in effect any ordinance or rule regarding a lowvoltage alarm system project that <u>provides additional requirements beyond</u> <u>those set out in this section for the installation or maintenance of a lowvoltage alarm system project or that is otherwise</u> is inconsistent with this section.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
