Senate Bill No. 294

An act relating to the designation of buildings and facilities: designating the baseball field at Florida A & M University as the "Oscar A. Moore-Costa Kittles Baseball Field": designating the tennis courts at Florida A & M University as the "Althea Gibson Tennis Courts"; designating the Athletic Center at Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton Campus as the "Tom Oxley Athletic Center and Fields": designating a new Fine Arts Building at Florida Atlantic University's John D. MacArthur Campus in Jupiter as the "Hibel Fine Arts Building"; designating new classroom and office space for the College of Business at Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton Campus as the "Carl DeSantis Pavilion": designating the new presidential residence at Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton Campus as the "Eleanor R. Baldwin House"; designating Academic Building #2 at Florida Gulf Coast University as "Charles B. Reed Hall"; designating the Student Services Building at Florida Gulf Coast University as "Roy E. McTarnaghan Hall": designating the Seminole Golf Course at Florida State University as the "Don A. Veller Seminole Golf Course"; designating Building #76 at Florida State University as "William A. Tanner Hall": designating Building #1012 on the Panama City Campus of Florida State University as the "Larson M. Bland Conference Center"; designating the new clubhouse building at the Seminole Golf Course at Florida State University as the "David Middleton Golf Center"; designating the Administration Building at the University of Central Florida as "Millican Hall": designating the Humanities and Fine Arts Building at the University of Central Florida as "Colbourn Hall": designating the facility to house the Honors College at the University of Central Florida as "Burnett Hall"; designating the Cancer Center at the University of Florida as the "Jerry W. and Judith S. Davis Cancer Center"; designating the University Athletic Center at the University of Florida as the "L. Gale Lemerand Athletics Center": designating the tennis facility at the University of Florida as the "Alfred A. Ring Tennis Complex"; designating the Center for the Performing Arts at the University of Florida as the "Curtis M. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts": designating the Golf Management and Learning Center at the University of North Florida as the "John and Geraldine Hayt Golf Management and Learning Center"; designating the student residence currently known as Gamma Hall at the University of South Florida as "Betty Castor Hall": designating the IFAS North Florida Research and Education Center as the "Fount May, Sr., Research Center"; designating the School of Architecture building at the University Park Campus of the Florida International University as the "Paul L. Cejas School of Architecture Building"; designating the new residence hall at the University of West Florida as "John G. Martin Hall"; designating certain property at University Drive and Pembroke Road in Pembroke Pines as the Senator Howard C. Forman Human Services Campus"; authorizing the erection of suitable markers; designating the renovated student services area at the

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University of Central Florida as the "Jimmy A. Ferrell Student Services Commons"; designating the state veterans' home in Pembroke Pines as the "Alexander 'Sandy' Nininger, Jr., State Veterans' Nursing Home"; designating the Bartow Agricultural Center as the "Bob Crawford Agricultural Center;" designating the Science and Education Building at the Southeast Campus of Florida Atlantic University in Davie as the "Senator James A. Scott Building"; designating a bridge on the Jensen Beach Causeway in Martin County as the "Frank Wacha Bridge"; authorizing the respective universities to erect suitable markers; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. <u>The baseball field at Florida A & M University is hereby</u> <u>designated as the "Oscar A. Moore-Costa Kittles Baseball Field."</u>

Section 2. <u>The tennis courts at Florida A & M University are hereby</u> <u>designated as the "Althea Gibson Tennis Courts."</u>

Section 3. <u>The Athletic Center at Florida Atlantic University's Boca</u> <u>Raton Campus is hereby designated as the "Tom Oxley Athletic Center and</u> <u>Fields."</u>

Section 4. <u>A new Fine Arts Building at Florida Atlantic University's John</u> <u>D. MacArthur Campus in Jupiter is hereby designated as the "Hibel Fine</u> <u>Arts Building" in recognition of Edna Hibel.</u>

Section 5. <u>New classroom and office space for the College of Business at</u> Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton Campus is hereby designated as the "Carl DeSantis Pavilion."

Section 6. <u>The new presidential residence at Florida Atlantic Universi-</u> ty's Boca Raton Campus is hereby designated as the "Eleanor R. Baldwin <u>House.</u>"

Section 7. <u>Academic Building #2, which houses the Colleges of Arts &</u> <u>Sciences and Business at Florida Gulf Coast University, is hereby desig-</u> <u>nated as "Charles B. Reed Hall" in recognition of the former chancellor of</u> <u>the State University System of Florida.</u>

Section 8. <u>The Student Services Building at Florida Gulf Coast Univer-</u> sity is hereby designated as the "Roy E. McTarnaghan Hall" in recognition of the founding president of Florida Gulf Coast University.

Section 9. <u>The Seminole Golf Course at Florida State University is</u> <u>hereby designated as the "Don A. Veller Seminole Golf Course."</u>

Section 10. <u>Building #76 at Florida State University is hereby designated</u> <u>as "William A. Tanner Hall."</u>

Section 11. <u>Building #1012, located on the Panama City Campus of Flor-</u> <u>ida State University, is hereby designated as the "Larson M. Bland Confer-</u> <u>ence Center."</u>

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Section 12. <u>The new clubhouse building at the Seminole Golf Course at</u> <u>Florida State University is hereby designated as the "David Middleton Golf</u> <u>Center."</u>

Section 13. <u>The building known as the Administration Building located</u> <u>at the University of Central Florida is hereby designated as "Millican Hall"</u> <u>in recognition of Dr. Charles N. Millican, the founding president of the</u> <u>University of Central Florida.</u>

Section 14. <u>The building known as the Humanities and Fine Arts Building at the University of Central Florida is hereby designated as "Colbourn</u> <u>Hall" in recognition of Dr. Trevor Colbourn, the second president of the</u> <u>University of Central Florida.</u>

Section 15. <u>The facility to house the Honors College at the University of</u> <u>Central Florida is hereby designated as "Burnett Hall."</u>

Section 16. <u>The Cancer Center at the University of Florida is hereby</u> <u>designated as the "Jerry W. and Judith S. Davis Cancer Center."</u>

Section 17. <u>The University Athletic Center at the University of Florida</u> <u>is hereby designated as the "L. Gale Lemerand Athletics Center."</u>

Section 18. <u>The tennis facility at the University of Florida is hereby</u> <u>designated as the "Alfred A. Ring Tennis Complex."</u>

Section 19. <u>The Center for the Performing Arts at the University of</u> <u>Florida is hereby designated as the "Curtis M. Phillips Center for the Per-</u><u>forming Arts."</u>

Section 20. <u>The Golf Management and Learning Center at the University</u> <u>of North Florida is hereby designated as the "John and Geraldine Hayt Golf</u> <u>Management and Learning Center."</u>

Section 21. <u>The student residence at the University of South Florida</u> <u>currently known as Gamma Hall is hereby designated as "Betty Castor</u> <u>Hall," in recognition of the fifth president of the University of South Florida.</u>

Section 22. <u>The IFAS North Florida Research and Education Center</u> <u>located at Quincy, Florida, is designated as the "Fount May, Sr., Research</u> <u>Center."</u>

Section 23. <u>Senator Howard C. Forman Human Services Campus designation; markers.</u>

(1) The property on University Drive and Pembroke Road in Pembroke Pines, upon which the state mental institution, the state veterans' home, and other human services institutions are located, is hereby designated as the Senator Howard C. Forman Human Services Campus.

(2) The Department of Children and Family Services is authorized to erect suitable markers for the "Senator Howard C. Forman Human Services Campus designation made by subsection (1).

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Section 24. <u>The School of Architecture building at the University Park</u> <u>Campus of the Florida International University is hereby designated as the</u> <u>"Paul L. Cejas School of Architecture Building."</u>

Section 25. <u>The new residence hall at the University of West Florida is</u> <u>hereby designated as "John G. Martin Hall."</u>

Section 26. <u>The renovated student services area at the University of</u> <u>Central Florida is hereby designated as the "Jimmy A. Ferrell Student</u> <u>Services Commons."</u>

Section 27. <u>The state veterans' home in Pembroke Pines is hereby designated as the "Alexander 'Sandy' Nininger, Jr., State Veterans' Nursing Home."</u>

Section 28. <u>The respective universities set forth in this act are authorized</u> to erect suitable markers for the designations made by this act.

Section 29. <u>The Bartow Agricultural Center is hereby redesignated as</u> <u>the "Bob Crawford Agricultural Center."</u>

Section 30. <u>The Science and Education Building at the Southeast Campus of Florida Atlantic University in Davie is renamed the "Senator James A. Scott Building."</u>

Section 31. Frank Wacha Bridge designation; markers.—

(1) The bridge on the Jensen Beach Causeway in Martin County is hereby designated as the "Frank Wacha Bridge."

(2) The Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable markers designating the "Frank Wacha Bridge" as described in subsection (1).

Section 32. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
