CHAPTER 2000-418

House Bill No. 1489

An act relating to the Canaveral Port Authority, Brevard County; amending article VII, chapter 28922, Laws of Florida, 1953; authorizing reimbursement for official travel; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 4 is added to article VII of chapter 28922, Laws of Florida, 1953, to read:

ARTICLE VII

- Section 4. Official travel authorized by the Canaveral Port Authority shall be reimbursed by the Authority in accordance with the following provisions:
- (1) All official travel performed within the State of Florida shall be reimbursable in accordance with s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (2) Official travel outside of the State of Florida but within the continental United States shall be reimbursable in accordance with s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, with the exception of the reimbursement rate for meals. The reimbursement rates for meals shall be as follows:

<u>(a)</u>	$\underline{\mathrm{Breakfast}}$	<u>\$ 5.00.</u>
<u>(b)</u>	$\underline{\text{Lunch}}$	\$11.00.
(c)	Dinner	\$22.00.

On October 1 of each year, the above meal rates will be adjusted by the Consumer Price Index, "All urban consumers, food away from home," by the change in the 12-month period preceding October 1.

(3) Official travel outside of the continental United States shall be reimbursable in accordance with s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, with the exception of meals. The reimbursement rate for meals shall be in accordance with the United States Department of State Standardized Regulations, Per Diem Supplement for all foreign areas. Once the daily meal rate has been determined by the applicable travel location, the following percentage rates will apply to the maximum daily rate allowed:

<u>(a)</u>	$\underline{\text{Breakfast}}$	14% of daily maximum rate.
<u>(b)</u>	$\underline{\text{Lunch}}$	28% of daily maximum rate.
<u>(c)</u>	<u>Dinner</u>	58% of daily maximum rate.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
