Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 697

An act relating to controlled substances; amending s. 893.03, F.S.; adding to the list of Schedule I controlled substances specified materials, compounds, mixtures, or preparations that contain hallucinogenic substances. or any of their salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, if the existence of such salts, isomers, and salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation; reenacting and amending s. 893.13(1)-(6), F.S., relating to prohibited acts and penalties involving controlled substances, to incorporate the amendment made to s. 893.03, F.S., in a reference thereto; providing reduced penalties for possession of 3 grams or less of specified controlled substances; amending s. 893.135, F.S.; providing that a person who knowingly sells, purchases, manufactures, delivers, or brings into this state specified quantities of 3,4-Methylenedioxymethcathinone, 3,4-Methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), or Methylmethcathinone, or who is knowingly in actual or constructive possession of specified quantities of 3,4-Methylenedioxymethcathinone, 3,4-Methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), or Methylmethcathinone, commits the offense of trafficking in Phenethylamines, a felony of the first degree; providing that a person who knowingly sells, purchases, manufactures, delivers, or brings into this state specified quantities of 3,4-Methylenedioxymethcathinone, 3,4-Methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), or Methylmethcathinone, or who is knowingly in actual or constructive possession of specified quantities of 3,4-Methylenedioxymethcathinone, 3,4-Methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), or Methylmethcathinone, commits the offense of capital manufacture or importation of Phenethylamines, a capital felony; providing criminal penalties; reenacting s. 921.0022(3)(b), (c), (e), and (g)-(i), F.S., relating to the Criminal Punishment Code, to incorporate the amendment made to ss. 893.03 and 893.135, F.S., in a reference thereto; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 893.03, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

893.03 Standards and schedules.—The substances enumerated in this section are controlled by this chapter. The controlled substances listed or to be listed in Schedules I, II, III, IV, and V are included by whatever official, common, usual, chemical, or trade name designated. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to include within any of the schedules contained in this section any excluded drugs listed within the purview of 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.22, styled "Excluded Substances"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.34, styled "Exempt Chemical Preparations"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.32, styled "Exempted Prescription Products"; or 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.34, styled "Exempt Anabolic Steroid Products."

- (1) SCHEDULE I.—A substance in Schedule I has a high potential for abuse and has no currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United States and in its use under medical supervision does not meet accepted safety standards. The following substances are controlled in Schedule I:

- Section 2. For the purpose of incorporating the amendment made by this act to section 893.03, Florida Statutes, in reference thereto, subsections (1) through (6) of section 893.13, Florida Statutes, are reenacted and amended to read:
 - 893.13 Prohibited acts; penalties.—
- (1)(a) Except as authorized by this chapter and chapter 499, \underline{a} it is unlawful for any person may not to sell, manufacture, or deliver, or possess with intent to sell, manufacture, or deliver, a controlled substance. \underline{A} Any person who violates this provision with respect to:
- 1. A controlled substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(d), (2)(a), (2)(b), or (2)(c)4., commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- 2. A controlled substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(c), (2)(c)1., (2)(c)2., (2)(c)3., (2)(c)5., (2)(c)6., (2)(c)7., (2)(c)8., (2)(c)9., (3), or (4) commits a

felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

- 3. A controlled substance named or described in s. 893.03(5) commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (b) Except as provided in this chapter, a person may not it is unlawful to sell or deliver in excess of 10 grams of any substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(a) or (1)(b), or any combination thereof, or any mixture containing any such substance. A Any person who violates this paragraph commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (c) Except as authorized by this chapter, <u>a it is unlawful for any person may not to sell, manufacture, or deliver, or possess with intent to sell, manufacture, or deliver, a controlled substance in, on, or within 1,000 feet of the real property comprising a child care facility as defined in s. 402.302 or a public or private elementary, middle, or secondary school between the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 midnight, or at any time in, on, or within 1,000 feet of real property comprising a state, county, or municipal park, a community center, or a publicly owned recreational facility. As used in For the purposes of this paragraph, the term "community center" means a facility operated by a nonprofit community-based organization for the provision of recreational, social, or educational services to the public. <u>A Any person who violates this paragraph with respect to:</u></u>
- 1. A controlled substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(d), (2)(a), (2)(b), or (2)(c)4., commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. The defendant must be sentenced to a minimum term of imprisonment of 3 calendar years unless the offense was committed within 1,000 feet of the real property comprising a child care facility as defined in s. 402.302.
- 2. A controlled substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(c), (2)(c)1., (2)(c)2., (2)(c)3., (2)(c)5., (2)(c)6., (2)(c)7., (2)(c)8., (2)(c)9., (3), or (4) commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- 3. Any other controlled substance, except as lawfully sold, manufactured, or delivered, must be sentenced to pay a \$500 fine and to serve 100 hours of public service in addition to any other penalty prescribed by law.

This paragraph does not apply to a child care facility unless the owner or operator of the facility posts a sign that is not less than 2 square feet in size with a word legend identifying the facility as a licensed child care facility and that is posted on the property of the child care facility in a conspicuous place where the sign is reasonably visible to the public.
